1948 FRBA Hall of Fame Inductee's

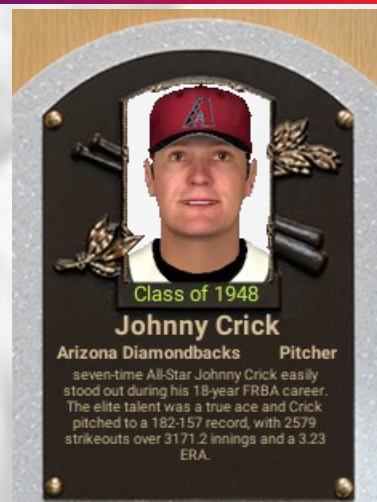
Congratulations to Johnny Crick and Pedro Soto as the two FRBA Hall of Fame Inductees for the 1948 class. Both players received an outstanding 92.9% of the votes.

Crick who dominated the FRBA leading the league in Strikeouts for 7 years in a row, including a season high of 360 in 1928 which is still a record.

Guess who is in 2nd place on that list, yep, it Crick with 299 in 1927.

Pedro Soto was a professional hitter during his time in FRBA. A four time MVP Winner ; 1931 and 1933-35. Not a Home Run hitter, Pedro was a double's hitting machine, cranking out a career 620 two baggers. A lifetime .306 hitter with a lifetime WAR of 78.96, Soto was a shoe in on this years ballot.
